EOW - Detective Micah Flick—2.05.2018

Sheriff Bill Elder asked that the statement below be shared with the members of IAATI:

It is with profound sadness that I advise the members of the International Association of Auto Theft Investigators of the loss of Det. Micah Flick, EOW 2.05.18. Det. Flick was observing his eleventh year of service with the El Paso County Sheriff's Office on the day he was killed.

Through his superior job performance and strong relationships with co-workers and the law enforcement community, Det. Flick rose quickly at the EPSO, taking on greater and greater responsibility. He loved investigations and was an advocate for car theft interdiction to prevent more serious crimes. Det. Flick was loved and respected, and was a natural leader.

On 2.05.18, Det. Flick was part of a multi-agency undercover auto theft investigations team working to arrest a car theft suspect when the suspect opened fire on the team.

Det. Flick lost his life, and three other team members were wounded: EPSO Sgt. Jake Abendschan and EPSO Deputy Scott Stone, and Det. Marcus Yanez of the Colorado Springs Police Department. A civilian also was wounded.

The show of support and outpouring of grief in Colorado Springs for Det. Flick was massive, heartwarming and appropriate. The community clearly supports its law enforcement officers.

February 5th, 2018, <u>The Gazette – Colorado Springs.com</u> reported that an El Paso County Sheriff's Deputy was shot to death, and two more deputies and a Colorado Springs police officer were wounded during a stolen car investigation Monday afternoon.

El Paso sheriff's deputy becomes third Colorado officer shot to death since Dec. 31
