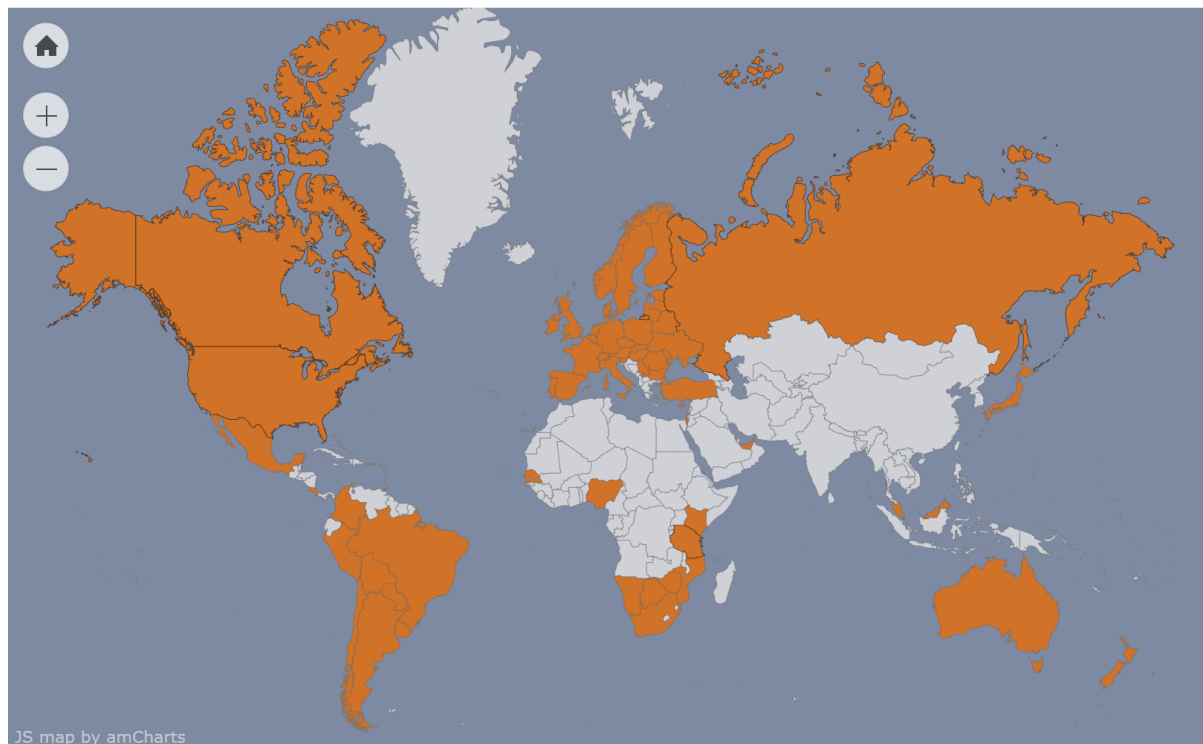
Where in the World? By Paul Thomas
