

Legendary People in IAATI History

We recently received news from John Daniel Jr., son of founding father and IAATI's 1st President, John Daniel Sr. On January 6, 2020, in Dallas, Texas, Geraldine Marie Daniel, John Jr.'s mother and wife (widow) of John Daniel Sr., passed away at the tender age of 101. Geraldine and John Sr. were married in 1946 but John passed away in 1991 after 45 years of marriage. Back in 2002, at our seminar in Albuquerque, Geraldine attended our conference as a guest of honor.

John Daniel Sr. was a police officer with the Dallas (TX), PD. In addition to being a founding member of IAATI, he was also a legendary police officer of his time. He joined the police in 1929 and actually patrolled on bicycle in the early days. His badge number was 14. There were no radios of course so they would have to call in via phone or "pull box". After a short time, John was assigned to auto theft. In 1932 he found himself in the Robbery and Homicide Division where he stayed until a transfer to "Bunko" and was promoted to Lieutenant. Sometime later he was promoted to Captain and head of Auto Theft.

John Sr. was somewhat of a legend during his years as a lawman. He was interviewed on the Dallas Morning News and was the subject of several TV shows including "The Case of the Slightly Used Car" and "The Man behind the Badge". John was involved in many high-profile investigations as head of Auto Theft including a close call with the Bonnie and Clyde gang. John spent 30 years with the Dallas PD. He retired in 1959. He passed away in 1991 and according to his son, John, was extremely proud of the direction and progress IAATI has made since its inception.

We gratefully acknowledge this information we received from John Daniel Jr. and the history and legacy left us by John Daniel Sr., our founding father.



The committee continually works on multiple issues regarding vehicle related crimes. Currently work groups are focusing on rental vehicle thefts, emerging technology issues and creating a vehicle crimes toolkit for smaller agencies.

More than 75% of crimes committed each year involve motor vehicles. The IACP Vehicle Crimes Committee recently developed a comprehensive educational toolkit for vehicle crimes investigations. The toolkit, along with the corresponding reference and resource guide and presentation, provides law with the information they need to enhance their response to vehicle related.



Raymond W. Dreher Award Committee Seeks Submissions for 2020 Submitted by Past President Denny Roske


