Ray Carroll, Executive Director, National Motor Vehicle Theft Reduction Council. "General update on trends and issues with motor vehicle theft from the perspective of the National Motor Vehicle Theft Council and IFRAG - Insurance Fraud Risk Assessment Group."

Ray was appointed Executive Director of the Council when it was formed in 1999 by all Australian governments in conjunction with the Insurance Council of Australia. The Council's charter is to work with government agencies, industry groups and the broader community to facilitate the implementation of a range of strategies to reduce the unacceptably high rate of motor vehicle theft in Australia.

Working for the Victorian Department of Justice as project manager of a combined government and industry national task force into motor vehicle theft in Australia in 1997, Ray was the principal author of the task force's final report which constituted a comprehensive five year vehicle theft reduction plan.

During twenty two years with the Victoria Police, Ray served in various areas of criminal investigation including the Fraud Squad and in his latter years of service specialised in crime prevention through his role as manager of the Force's crime prevention bureau.

Ray has recently been invited to chair the Insurance Fraud Risk Assessment Group

John completed his Bachelor of Law at Melbourne University in 1975. After practicing for a short period with Lander and Rogers, John joined Maurice Blackburn Cashman (then Maurice Blackburn and Co.) in April 1978 working in the personal injury section. He became a partner of the firm in 1984 and headed up the industrial personal injuries practice until retiring from the firm in 2004. John was an Accredited Personal Injuries Specialist having practiced in personal injuries litigation for over 27 years. John was also a member of the Accident Compensation Committee for more than 20 years, a member of the VWA Legal Liaison Committee and numerous Victorian Government working parties and advisory groups.

John joined the Insurance Ombudsman Service in August 2004 as Referee and was recently appointed to the Board of State Trustees Limited.

"Sustaining a denial for a fraudulent motor vehicle claim - What evidence do I need?"



Since joining the firm in 2002 from another CBD law firm where he managed a busy team with a mixed insurance litigation practice, Paul has become a major contributor to the outstanding growth of Turks Legal in the general insurance area.

Practising exclusively for insurers, Paul's areas of expertise include property damage (commercial, domestic and motor vehicle), arson theft and fraud claims, flood and water damage claims, householders and commercial property liability, and recovery actions on behalf of insurers. He has been advising insurers on motor vehicle and property fraud claims for more than ten years.

Paul is a highly experienced insurance litigator and he and his team regularly conduct litigation in the Supreme Court, District Court and Local Courts and the Consumer, Tenancy & Trader Tribunal. Paul is a member of the Australian Insurance Law Association and ANZIIF.

Paul's presentation will address the level of evidence required by a civil court to sustain an insurers denial of a claim based on an allegation of fraud. Paul will also look at some issues regarding privacy as it applies to investigators reports

Presentation:

"During an investigation of an allegedly stolen vehicle, much emphasis is place on the examination of the vehicle. I have found that much data can be retrieved from the examination of the insured's keys. In many cases, where there was a lack of vehicle data, the key examination provided significant mechanical and electronic data to make a determination. In many cases such data has been overlooked or contaminated. In today's electronic environment this data can be as volatile as it is critical."
