He is the Chair of the UK-based NASVE (National Association of Stolen Vehicle Examiners), whose mission goal is to promote best practices amongst Stolen Vehicle Examiners, support their development and skills and guide, support and help train newly certified examiners to expected industry standards. He has been a Board Member of the UK Branch of IAATI since 2017 (currently Branch Treasurer) and served on the International Board of IAATI since 2019 (currently a Director).

lain joined the Strathclyde Police in 1993 and after six years in various roles, became a Stolen Vehicle Examiner. In 2013, he was appointed Force Stolen Vehicle Examiner for Police Scotland where he was responsible Force-wide for the examination and identification of stolen, suspect stolen vehicles and the traceability of component parts back to original vehicles proving provenance, and the preparation of reports containing evidentiary material to support the prosecution of offenders by the COPFS. He also provided teaching inputs on vehicle crime at the Scottish Police College and other locations. He has written and developed bespoke training materials on the subject and is the co-author of the current College of Policing National Policing Curriculum Learning Standard on Stolen Vehicle Examination. Since retiring form Police Scotland Iain has establish McKinlay Davis Consultants Ltd.
